Kharkov, Ukraine

- Ukraine was part of the Soviet Union from 1922-1991.
- Ukrainian is the national language, yet 24% speak Russian.¹
- Abortion is permitted until the 22nd week and remains a central method of fertility control.²
- In 1996, Ukraine had the 6th highest abortion rate in the world: 57 abortions per 1,000 women aged 15-44 (the U.S. was 36th with 22.9 per 1,000).³

Ministering to One Client at a Time Brings a Great Reward

Some time ago, we had a Christmas party for the families we'd ministered to in the last two years. We sent out invitations; 50 people responded. We reserved a church. We planned it out: we'd share the love of Christ and the great news given to all people when Jesus was born. We'd give the little ones presents. A team of youth would put on a drama. We would sing songs, share the Word, and eat together.

The night of the party, the church was so full we didn't have space for the KPAC team to sit. I can't tell you how excited we all were! Sasha, who leads the parenting classes, said, "Are all of them our clients?" It was hard to believe. I remembered Isaiah 49:19-21: Though you were ruined and made desolate and your land laid waste, now you will be too small for your people, and those who devour you will be far away. The children born during your bereavement will yet say in your hearing, "This place is too small for us; give us more space to live in." Then you will say in your heart, "Who bore me these? I was bereaved and barren; I was exiled and rejected. Who brought these up? I was left alone, but these – where have they come from?"

We want you to share this joy with us. These people, these children, are the fruit of the work of a team, and you are part of that team. Yesterday, I read, "We can really keep only what we give away." I am glad that in heaven you are having a reward.
